Spring 2018 Paramedic Program

The IUP Institute for Rural Health and Safety announces the spring 2018 Paramedic Program. This program is primarily designed for future EMS personnel, but is appropriate for anyone who may respond to emergencies including fire/rescue personnel, nurses, coaches or athletic trainers, safety professionals, etc. Participants who successfully complete this program are eligible to take National Registry of Paramedics certification exams for PA and national certification as a paramedic.

PREREQUISITE: Students must be a certified Emergency Medical Technician

COURSE REQUIREMENTS: Course includes online components (inter-active lectures, and assigned readings), lab and classroom, skills, and field sessions. Students must meet minimum physical capabilities of PA DOH. In addition, **the student is also responsible for the following fees, NOT included in the above program fees.**

- Successful completion of an EMT course approved by PA DOH
- Caroline AAOS 7th Edition text book and workbook (printed copy if student desires)
- Physical examination(s)
- Required blood work
- Drug screen(s)
- Parking at clinical and/or field sites



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- Fuel for your personal vehicle to travel to and from class and clinical/field sites
- National Registry CBE and any retests
- Any retest(s) or site fees for the National Registry practical exams
- Uniform: BDU pants, work boots
- Equipment: stethoscope, pen light, trauma scissors, EKG calipers,

Teaching Learning Methods

Teaching-Learning Methods in this course may include but are not limited to the following: assigned readings, interactive lectures, discussion, critical thinking activities, paramedic portfolio lab.

- To better prepare our students, the IUP Paramedic Program is intended to allow our students to think critically. To better develop the critical thinking process, it is mandatory that students complete the required interactive lectures, required readings and pre-course assignments prior to class/lab.
- During classes and labs, questions will be asked concerning the interactive lecture materials, electronic readings, and/or pre-course/lab assignments. If students have questions regarding course materials or course structure, the instructor will respond either by verbally explanation or through the use of visuals materials (ex. PowerPoint).
- Labs are designed to reinforce and clarify the information obtained from the students from the interactive lectures, electronic readings and pre-course assignments. This allows the students to gain the knowledge and skills to successfully complete the course and become an entry competent paramedic in the cognitive, affective and psychomotor domains.

Interactive Lecture Overview

Additionally, the Navigate eReader is not compatible with mobile devices with screen sizes smaller than 7 inches. Users on smaller screens cannot necessarily access all functionality. Payment Plan Option 1:

1. A minimum of \$1,000 payment is due when you are accepted into the program. **(No later than January 8th, 2018)** This payment is non-refundable. Make payment at www.iup.edu/marketplace Click the Deposit Tab.
2. A minimum of \$1,000.00 deposit is due before or on the first day of class which is **January 22, 2018**. This payment is non-refundable. Make payment at www.iup.edu/marketplace Click 2nd Deposit Tab.
3. The remaining payment will be due no later than 90 days from the start of class. This date is **April 9th, 2018**. This is non-refundable. Make payment at www.iup.edu/marketplace Click the Balance Due Tab.
4. Students must have tuition paid in full. If the entire payment for the program is not received by the due date, the student will not be eligible to sit for the certification exam and the account will be referred to a collection agency.

Payment Plan Option 2:

1. A minimum of \$1,000.00 is due when you are accepted into the program. This payment is nonrefundable. (Deposit Tab) **NO LATER than January 8th, 2018.**
2. A minimum of \$2,500.00 deposit is due before or on the first day of class, **January 22, 2018**, (BEFORE class BEGINS) This payment is nonrefundable. (Second Deposit Tab) **Students who withdraw from the course are responsible for the remaining balance.**
3. The remaining balance will be paid monthly. \$272.73 will be due the first day of each month starting February 1, 2018, through December 1, 2018.
4. Students must have tuition paid in full. If the entire payment for the program is not received by the due date, the student will not be eligible to sit for the certification exam and the account will be referred to a collection agency.



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Refund Policy:

We do not offer a refund for payments or fees made.

Withdrawal Policy:

A student may withdraw from the program at any time through the completion of a signed withdrawal form. If a student chooses to withdraw from the program, the **student remains responsible to pay the tuition in its entirety**. See refund policy.
